### Year 11: Pearsons Level 1 / 2 BTEC Tech Award in Health & Social Care:

#### Component 1- Human Lifespan Development

Learners explore human development and investigate how, in real situations; human development is affected by different factors and life events e.g. imprisonment, redundancy, parenthood, bereavement etc.

#### Component 2- Health and Social Care Services and Values

Learners explore health and social care services and how they meet the needs of real service users. They also develop skills in applying care values and how barriers to accessing health and social care provision can be overcome.

# Component 3- Health and Wellbeing

Learners will study the factors that affect health and well-being, learning about physiological and lifestyle indicators and how to design a health and well-being improvement plan.

# Year 10: OCR Level 1 / 2 Cambridge National in Health & Social Care:

# RO32: Principles of care in HSC settings (not started till June 2023)

This unit is assessed by an **exam**. In this unit you will learn about the key topics that are important when caring for and protecting people in health and social care. Topics include:

- o Topic Area 1 The rights of service users in health and social care settings
- o Topic Area 2 Person-centred values
- o Topic Area 3 Effective communication in health and social care settings
- o Topic Area 4 Protecting service users and service providers in health and social care settings
- 1 hour 15 mins exam during Year 11

### RO33: Supporting individuals through life events (completed Sept to Dec 2022)

This unit is assessed by a **Set Assignment**. In this unit you will learn about growth and development through the life stages. You will also learn how to understand the needs of individuals who have been affected by life events and how to recommend support to meet their needs. Topics include:

- o Topic Area 1 Life stages
- o Topic Area 2 Impacts of life events
- o Topic Area 3 Sources of support
- 10-12 hours to complete a set assignment in school.

#### RO35: Health Promotion Campaigns (completed Jan to April 2023)

This unit is assessed by a Set Assignment. In this unit you will research health promotion campaigns and learn about their benefits to society. You will also plan and deliver your own health promotion campaign. Topics include:

- o Topic Area 1 Current public health issues and the impact on society
- o Topic Area 2 Factors influencing health
- o Topic Area 3 Plan and create a health promotion campaign
- o Topic Area 4 Deliver and evaluate a health promotion campaign
- 10-12 hours to complete a set assignment in school.

#### **Additional Information:**

BTEC regulations - All work must be submitted at the deadline. If work does not meet requirements one extension 15 days from the submission date may be granted to improve work. If this does not meet requirement or the deadline is missed a new assignment will be issued where a maximum grade of a Pass can be awarded.
