Subject Content

- Topic 1** Global Hazards – how can weather be hazardous? How do plate tectonics shape our world?
- Topic 2** Changing Climate – What evidence is there to suggest climate change is a natural process?
- Topic 3** Distinctive Landscapes – What makes a landscape distinctive? What influences the landscape in the UK?
- Topic 4** Sustaining Ecosystems – Why are natural ecosystems important? Why should tropical rainforests matter to us? Is there more to polar environments than ice?
- Topic 5** Urban Futures – Why do more than half the world’s population live in urban areas? What are the challenges and opportunities for cities today?
- Topic 6** Dynamic Development – Why are some countries richer than others? Are LIDCs likely to stay poor?
- Topic 7** UK in the 21st Century – How is the UK changing in the 21st century? Is the UK losing its global significance?
- Topic 8** Resource reliance – Will we run out of natural resources? Can we feed nine billion people by 2050?

Students are also required to know about specific place and be able to refer to this in the exam. There are 12 case studies from around the world and many links to the UK. Student can use their own place knowledge and experiences as well as the places we study in class.

- Natural weather event in the UK
- Natural weather event non-UK based
- Tectonic event that is hazardous to people: causes, consequences and response to the event
- Coastal landscape in the UK
- River basin in the UK
- Tropical rainforest: sustainable management
- Arctic / Antarctic: small scale sustainable management (e.g. sustainable tourism / conservation and whaling)
- Arctic / Antarctic: global example of sustainable management (e.g. Antarctic treaty)

Assessment Details

Paper 1 – Our Natural World: 1 hour 15 minutes.
Questions on topics one to four plus physical geography field work (rivers).

Paper 2 – People and Society: 1hour 15 minutes
Questions on topics five to eight plus human field work (local area)

Paper 3 – Geographical Exploration: 1 hour 30 minutes
A series of questions focusing on synoptic assessment of material from a range of topics across the whole course and will feature a decision-making exercise.

These have been adapted for the exams in Summer 2022. The students do not have to carry out field work and will not be asked questions on what they have completed. There will also be a choice of question in Paper 1. The length of the papers will be changed to account for this.
