Uniform

Please can parents and carers ensure that all students are in the correct uniform for the start of the new term in September. Full details are on the school website under 'Parents' and 'Uniform'. There should be no facial piercings at all, this includes nose piercings. Earrings should be restricted to one small earring in each ear. Students must be in shoes and not trainers and be wearing a blazer and the black school tie. Leggings and shorts are not permitted. If students are not in the correct uniform, they can expect one or a combination of the below to be applied from September 2023. It is expected that on most occasions it may be possible to loan a student an item of clean uniform which must be returned at the end of the day.

- Refusal to wear the uniform provided will result in the student working in a designated area until the correct uniform is brought to them, or until such time the uniform is corrected
- A break and lunchtime detention will be sanctioned.
- The student may be sent home to change with prior consent from parents.
- Prohibited items will be subject to confiscation and require collection by a parent or carer.

Persistent breach of the uniform policy will be escalated through our sanctions policy for persistent non-compliance.

Vaping in school

We have recently had a small number of students bringing in vapes into school and using them in the toilet. If caught, students will face a severe sanction and have any vapes confiscated. However, we are as concerned about the negative health impact vaping amongst teenagers can cause. Vape "smoke" contains:

- Nicotine, shown to increase the risk of cancer, heart disease, stroke, lung diseases, diabetes, and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease
- Ultrafine particles that can be inhaled deep into the lungs
- A <u>Harvard study</u> found that the vaping flavouring chemical called diacetyl is linked to a condition called "popcorn lung," which causes scarring and obstruction in the lungs
- Cancer-causing chemicals
- Heavy metals, such as nickel, tin, and lead.


Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust

What do you do with your old school uniform?

A new survey has found that 1.4 million school uniform items are thrown away each year. Many of these items, such as shirts, dresses and trousers, are made from a mixture of materials including polyester or acrylic - which are 100% plastic.

The survey found that just over 350 tonnes of plastic were ending up in a landfill each year, from uniform alone, which can take many decades to break down.

According to the survey by My Nametags, many uniform items are still in good condition when they're thrown away.

Instead, the study suggest families should donate unneeded and outgrown items to uniform banks, siblings or friends.

Donating uniforms isn't just good for the environment, it can also help families save money as uniforms can be very expensive.


Revision Guides: Please don't throw them away

When do universities get my results?

Only exams office staff and heads can view A-level results before they're widely released to candidates on Thursday 17 August 2023.

From 12.01am on the day before - referred to as restricted release day - results are available from exam boards such as the AQA (Assessment and Qualifications Alliance) and OCR (Oxford, Cambridge and RSA).

However, at this stage, these results must be treated as confidential by universities and exam offices.

What time does UCAS Hub update on results day?

As UCAS Hub is where you're kept informed of your application's progress, the UCAS site is the place to go on results day. However, UCAS Hub is 'frozen' in the days leading to the publication of your A-level results, meaning you won't be able to make any changes during this time. Contact UCAS directly if you need to update any information.

The system will be available at around 8am on results day, but it can often take a few hours for UCAS to update and allow you to make any changes.

What will UCAS Hub show?

If decisions have been made by your university choices, and UCAS have been notified, you can expect to see the following changes to offers on UCAS Hub:

- Unconditional your place on the course has been confirmed. This may be your firm or insurance offer, or both.
- Unsuccessful you've not been accepted by your choice(s). You're now eligible to enter Clearing.
- Unconditional Changed Course (UCC) you don't have the necessary grades for your offer, but the university has proposed a similar course requiring lower grades. They may also offer an alternative start date, such as deferred entry. You have five days to decide and can discuss the opportunity with the university in question.

Bear in mind that your A-level results won't appear in UCAS Hub.

What do I do if I meet my offer?


If you're holding at least one conditional place and you've met the requirements, the offer will change to 'unconditional'. This firm acceptance is confirmed in UCAS Hub, and you'll then receive details on what you need to do next, and when - either from UCAS, or directly from the university. For example, some institutions will ask you to provide evidence of your qualifications.

If you've used UCAS Extra to add another choice - and have been offered a place - you'll just need to accept it by the date displayed in UCAS Hub. There's also the option of adding another choice, should you wish to decline the offer.

What if I don't get the grades I need?

Don't panic, as there are a number of options open to you and we will be in school to help support and guide you.


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Rewards Day

Students were treated to a day of inflatables to reward their hard work and efforts throughout the year.







